## **Project Alternatives:**

**Alternative #1** (No action): The 'no action' alternative would continue to place these structures at a high risk of being affected by the floodplain. The subject properties would remain susceptible to any future flooding events. The damages and risk of potential loss of life would continue to be a threat if no action is taken.

**Alternative** #2 (Elevation): Elevating the subject structures would reduce but not eliminate the risk of being impacted by future flooding events. However, the owners of this commercial property have selected acquisition, and due to the nature of the structure, successful elevation would be impractical and undesirable.
